

Streets of Bournemouth History & Heritage


People have lived in the area now called Bournemouth since at least the Late Upper Palaeolithic when there was a reindeer hunters' camp at Hengistbury Head. By 1800, there were farms within the heathland at Stourfield and Littledown. Most people, however, lived in the hamlets along the Stour valley between Wick and Kinson. Apart from Kinson which was in Dorset, the area was mainly within the parishes of Holdenhurst and Christchurch. The Bourne stream gave local fishermen and smugglers a place to beach their boats and an easy route inland to Kinson and past Hurn.

The 1802 Christchurch Inclosure Act allowed local landowners to buy large areas of the heathlands. Lewis Tregonwell leased land from Sir George Ivison Tapps in 1810 and built his house (now the Royal Exeter Hotel). By 1838, the marine village of Bourne opened its first hotel. In 1856, the Bournemouth Improvement Act allowed the town to start its separate existence.

Historical setting

The village of Holdenhurst has been described as the Mother of Bournemouth. Arguably the real mother of Bournemouth is the Bourne stream. It has two tributaries. The first rises near Loewy Crescent south of Ringwood Road South and trickles east into Bourne Bottom south of Wallisdown Road. It runs through Alder Hills nature reserve and under the embankment of the mainline Bournemouth to Poole railway. It emerges into the upper reaches of the Bourne valley gardens. The other tributary rises near Rossmore Community College and today emerges from a culvert that joins the Bourne stream below Coy Pond. The enhanced more swiftly flowing stream is canalised as it flows through the Upper, Central and Lower Gardens. The final section is culverted before it flows into the sea.

The landscape which has become Bournemouth contains many traces of its earliest occupants, from the Bronze Age onwards. Few stayed for long, but their presence is preserved in street names such as Thistlebarrow Road. The most distinctive evidence of this long presence of humans is at Hengistbury Head, the last area to be integrated into present-day Bournemouth in 1932. A Stone Age (late Upper Palaeolithic) Reindeer Camp dates from about 12,300 years ago when the climate was colder and sea level was lower so that the headland overlooked broad river valleys rather than the sea. By the Iron Age, sea level had risen to its present level, and an area enclosed by the earthworks at Double Dykes was an active port and trading place, perhaps the first 'town' in the area.

The present town's name, "La Bournemowthe", was first recorded in 1406.

After the Norman Conquest in 1066 all the land in England became the property of the monarch. King William I undertook an audit of his lands for tax purposes which became known as the Domesday Book. King William gave parcels of land to the lords and barons in return for their loyalty. Under the feudal system the lords in turn gave land to tenants in exchange for services such as labour, goods and produce and military service when necessary. An estate or manor might consist of a manor house, several tenant farmers and a mill. Both Holdenhurst and Kinson are



recorded in the Domesday Book and each had a flour mill.

Histories of Bournemouth all-too frequently suggest that the landscape on which the town was built was uninhabited waste land, but this is far from the truth. The economy of the area was a rural one, dependent on the seasonality of agricultural life. The best agricultural land was the fertile strip of land along the flood plain of the River Stour. The settlements at Wick, Tuckton, Iford, Holdenhurst, Throop, Muccleshell, Muscliff, Redhill, Ensbury, Kinson and Cudnell were part of a pastoral way of life that hadn't changed for centuries.

The people living in these villages would have access to the valuable resources of the sea for fish and access to the heath. Every manor had waste land which was part of the economic life of the community. It would be a place to graze pigs and cattle, gather heather and bracken for animal bedding, shared resources for communities to live and work from. Most important of all was the right to dig turf and gather wood for fuel. For many people it was not always a rural idyll but an existence of borderline poverty.



The Christchurch Inclosure Act 1802

Enclosure was the means by which areas of land were divided into smaller units and enclosed by fences and hedges. Many of the former open fields of medieval villages had previously been divided and enclosed but the enclosure movement of the 18th and 19th centuries resulted in the extensive redistribution of land.

At the turn of the 19th century England was at war with France. There was a genuine fear of invasion or that Napoleon Bonaparte would block the English ports leading to starvation. Enclosing the waste land would increase the production of food. Common land could only be enclosed by Act of Parliament.

In 1801 several local landowners including the Lord of the Manor of Christchurch, Sir George Ivison Tapps, presented a bill to Parliament for enclosure of the common and wastelands in the neighbourhood of Christchurch. This was the area that would eventually become the modern town of Bournemouth. The bill received the Royal Assent and three Commissioners were appointed to prepare the enclosure *Award*. The *Award* was completed in 1805 and set out the new allotments of land. Each plot of land was identified by a number on a map that related to an accompanying Schedule. For each plot the Schedule would state the landowner's name, extent of holdings

and nature of the tenure. The result was that major landowners in the area suddenly gained hundreds of acres of new freehold land at virtually no cost to themselves.

The area subject to the Inclosure Act (5084 acres 1 rood and 9 square perches) was divided into 241 plots. 29 plots were set aside for roads, mainly along the existing tracks, and 15 acres of gravel pits to supply road-building materials, plus one for clay. Just over 1258 acres were sold to meet the expenses of administering the Act. Seven individuals bought them for for a total of £4100 14 shillings and 11 pence.

Sir George Ivison Tapps, Lord of the Manor, who lived at Hinton Admiral, bought 205 acres and was allocated a further 240 acres as compensation for loss of rights and interest in soil and the loss of common rights. William Driver bought 236 acres at Redhill and Moordown and Philip Norris acquired 152 acres at Boscombe and Strouden. The Earl of Malmesbury who lived at Hurn (or

Heron) Court bought 59 acres and was allocated 316 acres in lieu of tithes. William Dean acquired just over 500 acres on the West Cliff and around King's Park. He paid £1 and 8 shillings per acre, much less than Tapps who paid £5 and 2 shillings per acre.

About 40 people gained land as a result of the enclosure, but the two most important were the main Sir George Ivison Tapps and William Dean, with 1149 acres 2 roods and 34 square perches and 1137 acres and 14 square perches respectively. Although their lands were managed quite differently, both had very significant impacts on the future layout and development of the town.

A quite different outcome was when the Commissioners allocated nine strips of five acres each at the top of Richmond Hill to three widows, Mary Vincent, Mrs Tarrant and Martha Watton and three labourers, William Troke, Peter Wareham and William Dowden, all from Muscliff.

The heath had been used by villagers for cutting turf for fuel and they feared that this ancient right would be lost when the heath was enclosed. William West an educated man who farmed at Muscliff was persuaded to put their concerns to the Inclosure Commissioners. Farmer West was successful in proving their claims and the Commissioners allocated five areas totalling 424 acres as *turbary*, or turf for fuel, to the occupants of 86 qualifying cottages. It was not to be used for grazing animals. The land was to be held in trust for them by the Lord of the Manor.

In the short term the major landowners had little money to spare to improve the land and even less incentive when Napoleon was defeated at the Battle of Waterloo in 1815. The soil was poor, it could grow gorse, heather and some grasses but certainly not crops or cereal for bread. Sir George Tapps laid out large plantations of pine trees as an alternative. A contemporary account reports that poorly paid labourers planted thousands of trees, but hardly cared whether the branches or roots went into the soil first. Sir George might well have seen Lewis Tregonwell's interest in buying several acres to build a house as a better use of this otherwise unproductive land.

Even after Tregonwell arrived in 1810 there was little change to most of the heath. The existing agricultural land and the various farms remained central to the economy of the area. Thirty years later when the survey for the Tithe Awards took place it was only at Bourne where there had been a noticeable change to the landscape. Even so, the Christchurch Inclosure Act of 1802 had far-reaching consequences by making land available for development. A way of life that had existed for 1,000 years slowly came to end.

The Early Road Patterns

The principal valleys across the land are the Bourne Valley following the line of the Bourne River emptying into the sea by Bournemouth Pier and Longman's Bottom which cuts through Queen's Park to emerge at Blackwater where there used to be a crossing across the River Stour. Wooded valleys or *Chines* ran down from the heath to the sea. The valleys were frequently boggy so the tracks across the heath avoided them where possible



The lines of the roads and boundaries formalised in the 1805 Inclosure Award (see map above) created the framework on which Bournemouth grew. Old smugglers' tracks acted as guidelines for the new roads across the heath but were not followed precisely. An old track from the Bourne took a gently rising path up through what is now Horseshoe Common on to the heath but the new road ran steeply up Richmond Hill. The long straight course of Wimborne Road, Charminster Road and Holdenhurst Road all date from this time.

The Lord of the Manor of Canford Magna the William Francis Spencer Ponsonby had also promoted the enclosure of land. In the Canford Award of 1822 the routes of Wallisdown Road, Columbia Road and Kinson Road were established. Most of the enclosure boundaries have disappeared under later development but evidence of an enclosure bank can be seen as an occasional low ridge running through Meyrick Park and Strouden Park. The line of the rear gardens in Tregonwell Road follows the boundary between Sir George Ivison Tapps' land and William Clapcott's land.

An unforeseen consequence of the Christchurch Inclosure Act was the preservation of common land that would become Bournemouth's modern-day parks. It concerned the Inclosure Award allotments



numbers 58-62 which had been held in trust by the Lord of the Manor for the rights of certain properties to continue to cut turf. By the end of the 19th century these 5 areas were 'given back' to the people of Bournemouth. The first was Meyrick Park when Sir George Meyrick surrendered his rights in Allotment No 62 and this was formalised in the Bournemouth Park Lands Act 1889. Meyrick Park opened on 28th November 1894. Queen's Park, Redhill Common, and Seafeld Gardens in Southbourne were to follow. Modern day Turbary Common in Kinson had also been allocated for turf cutting in the Canford Award.



The Marine Village

Decoy Pond appears on many early maps of Poole Heath. Decoy Pond cottage was built in the 13th century and was also known as Decoy Pond House and Bourne House. It no longer exists but was located close to the present-day war memorial in the Central Gardens. From here Sir George Ivison Tapps and his guests would go duck shooting.

Decoy Pond House appears in a tale of local smugglers. About 1780 a gang of ruffians under orders from the smugglers broke into the Iford home of William Manuel. Manuel was believed to have informed the Revenue Officers of smuggling activities. His son Joseph Manuel was taken away by force across the heath to Decoy Pond House. He was then taken on board a smuggling cutter, and carried away to Alderney in the Channel Islands.

The local gentry would often turn a blind eye to smuggling in return for a share of the contraband. Lord Malmesbury recalled one local squire who dined with his back to the windows so that he could truthfully report that he had never seen the smugglers go past. The job of stopping the smugglers rested with the Dorset Volunteer Rangers, whose role was to '*serve in case of riots and tumults . . . and in case of invasion in any part of Great Britain*'. The officers were drawn from the important families of Dorset such as the Bankes, Portman, Grosvenor and Weld families. Amongst them was Captain Lewis Tregonwell of Cranborne.

The Tapps Inn replaced the 18th century Bourne House which had been a Preventative Station from which coastguards hope to prevent the smugglers from landing. Tregonwell bought the inn from the Gervis Estate in 1810 and renamed it the Tregonwell Arms. It has become something of a local legend that Tregonwell was part of the smuggling network but there is no documentary evidence to support the story.

Tregonwell bought three separate plots of from Sir George Ivison Tapps in an area to the west of the Bourne Stream which was then a remote marshy ford. He purchased the first plot in 1810 and built a house on the hill above the river called The Mansion. Over the next 10 years Tregonwell added more land to his estate building a few houses that could be rented to prosperous friends for the summer. He also built a cottage especially for his butler, Symes. He made the estate attractive with gardens, an orchard and a woodland walk. Cranborne Lodge remained the principal home of Lewis and his second wife Henrietta and they were not regular visitors to their new summer home. If The Mansion



was let they would stay in one of the smaller properties. Their enjoyment of the isolated Bourne lasted for a quarter of a century as the Tregonwell Estate was to remain the only major development in the area. The widowed Henrietta was staying at Bourne in 1841 and died there in 1846.

The catalyst for change at Bournemouth came in 1835 when Sir George Ivison Tapps died and his 40-year-old son Sir George William Tapps-Gervis inherited the estate. The estate included 205 acres of land along the cliff top from the Central Gardens partway to Boscombe bought by his father when the land was enclosed. Sir George engaged the Christchurch-born architect Benjamin Ferrey to design a 'Marine Village' on the opposite side of the Bourne River to Tregonwell's Estate. At this time Margate, Brighton, and Scarborough were already well-established marine spas and Sir George had an idea to create a fashionable and aristocratic colony.

The first visitors came to the seaside in the 18th century to enjoy the health-giving benefits of fresh air and sea water. They were mostly wealthy adults looking for alternatives to the spas such as Malvern or Bath which had become less exclusive. Doctors were looking for new sources of *health-giving* mineral waters both for their patients and to further their own careers. People were obsessed with their health and without modern medical knowledge sought cures everywhere. A new book published in 1752 promoted the benefits of sea water for good health. Dr Richard Russell's *A Dissertation on the Use of Sea Water in the Diseases of the Glands* recommended total immersion combined with drinking quantities of sea water every day as a purgative. The fashion for sea-bathing was given the royal seal of approval in 1789 when King George III emerged from under the waves at Weymouth in to the accompaniment of a band playing 'God Save the King'

Ferrey produced various plans and paintings showing how the marine village might look. One design showed a magnificent seafront building that would obviously provide all the facilities required by the most select visitors. Behind this was a row of elegant villas with a hotel at one end. Stretching along the cliff to the east was row upon row of elegant Georgian style terraces. The only parts of the plan to materialise apart were the villas along Westover Road with the Bath Hotel at the end. A small hotel, the Belle Vue, was built on the seafront in the place of the grand hotel in Ferrey's plan.

In 1840 Sir George instructed the architect Decimus Burton to design some gardens and wooded walks between Westover Road and the Bourne. Burton had created the monumental entrance to Hyde Park for King George IV. Sadly Sir George William Tapps-Gervis was to die two years later in 1842 at the age of 47 and the estate was left to his 15-year-old son Sir George Eliott Meyrick Tapps-



Gervis-Meyrick. As a young man of 15 he was not in a position to implement his late father's schemes especially as he would not complete his education at Christ Church College, Oxford until 1849. Even so the area was beginning to be known for sea-bathing and was attracting small numbers of visitors especially as a consequence of a book published by Dr Granville in 1841. *The Spas of England* described Bournemouth as having the potential to become 'England's foremost sea-watering place and winter resort'. The 1841 Census records 165 inhabitants living in 34 households.



Establishment as a town

Mary Dean of Littledown had married William Clapcott but their married life was marred by financial problems and debts. The family had become major landowners when William Dean, Mary's father, bought 500 acres at the time of the Enclosures. When William Clapcott died in 1833 his wife and son were left with crippling debts. On Mary's death in 1854 her son William Clapcott Dean discovered that she had provided him with the resources to pay back the debts which were mostly in the form of mortgages. At the age of 42 he was a wealthy man. He appointed Christopher Crabbe Creeke who was the surveyor for the Improvement Commissioners to review and make proposals for the remainder of the Dean estates. It was Creeke's proposals that formed the structure of much of modern Bournemouth identifying plots of land that could be sold for housing development. The plots were sold on 99-year leases with Dean retaining the freehold.

Although still a young man Sir George Elliott Meyrick Tapps-Gervis-Meyrick was to play an important role in the growth of Bournemouth. He was also one of the sponsors of the 1856 Bournemouth Improvement Act. The role of the thirteen commissioners was to administer the infrastructure of a growing town especially the practical matters of sewers, drainage and street lighting. Speculators began to take risks buying and selling land. The Marine Village of Bourne finally had the potential to emerge from being a small insignificant marine village to become Bournemouth the leading winter health resort in England.

There has probably never been a time when building work has not been taking place in Bournemouth. David Tuck was the only builder in Bournemouth to begin with. He built the first villa on Westover Road and several of the earliest roads. Other surveyors began measuring out the land for villas. While the town was slowly spreading out from the mouth of the Bourne developments were taking place in outer areas of the district. The first was the consolidation of the existing estates into the growing settlements of Pokesdown and Winton. The original settlements along the Stour continued slow but steady growth. These villages were establishing schools, churches or chapels which became focal points in the development of the outer districts. By 1841 there were schools, at Kinson, Pokesdown, Bourne and Winton. The outlying districts would provide some of the craftsmen and servants needed in the new town. Impoverished farm workers found work as carpenters, gardeners and bricklayers.



The modern boundary of Bournemouth runs from the tip of Hengistbury Head past the villages on the fertile strip of land south of the River Stour. Not far from Bear Cross the boundary leaves the river turning inland following the line of Ringwood Road, turning a sharp corner at Wallisdown Roundabout, travelling along Wallisdown Road, turning south again by Boundary Roundabout, crossing the Upper Gardens and the Bourne Stream by County Gates before emerging on the seafront between Branksome Dene Chine and Alum Chine.

The Tithe Map

Tithes were originally payments of agricultural produce for the upkeep of the parish church and the maintenance of the clergy. The Tithe Commutation Act 1836 ordered the replacement of tithes in kind by monetary payments. These payments were to be shared among the landowners of a parish in proportion to the extent of their holdings. The problem was that most parishes had no accurate maps that would enable such calculations to be made. So the first step was for all the land in the relevant parishes to be surveyed and mapped.

By 1841, there were just four female landowners in Holdenhurst parish, Harriet Tregonwell, Mary Clapcott, Jane Sweertapple and Lydia Troke.. Elizabeth Aldridge and Elizabeth Gaulter occupied land owned by Matthew Aldridge. Mary Clapcott, Sir George William Tapps Gervis and Matthew Aldridge owned most land recorded in the Tithe Apportionment.

The Apportionments list the owner and or Occupier of the land, its area, its name , and what it was being used for.
